The position is part of the international joint project "EMMELO - European Men, Masculinity, and Extremist Leadership Online" (Horizon Europe).

Your tasks

- Independent research within the international research project "EMMELO - European Men, Masculinity, and Extremist Leadership Online", in particular:
 - Scientific leadership of a work package within an international consortium and scientific collaboration on other work packages;
 - Critical discourse analysis with a focus on masculinity; creation and analysis of a data corpus from digital platforms on which right-wing extremists network;
 - Designing, conducting and analysing expert interviews with civil society actors and guideline-based qualitative interviews with people who were active in far-right online spaces;
- Active participation in the international project consortium, participation in hybrid project meetings and the final conference, reporting;
- Knowledge exchange, practice transfer and public relations work: development of recommendations for action and toolkits, active participation in scientific conferences, scientific publications.

Requirements and qualifications

You have

- a very good university degree (M.A., Diplom, Magister) in diversity research, gender studies, sociology, democracy research or a related social science subject;
- completed a PhD in a relevant subject (or are demonstrably advanced in pursuing a doctorate in a relevant subject);
- demonstrable expertise in right-wing extremism research and/or gender studies (e.g. thematically relevant thesis, publication, certificate);
- Experience in empirical social research, in particular participatory research, qualitative interviews and discourse analysis;
- Knowledge of data scraping/data mining and natural language processing (NLP) for analysing large data sets (or willingness to undergo further training to that effect);
- Proven knowledge or experience in project management (international project experience is an advantage);
- Experience in working with practitioners, especially in the field of extremism prevention;
- Reliability, independence, flexibility, teamwork and communication skills, diversity competence;
- Very good working knowledge of both German and English.
