

The University of Neuchâtel invites applications for the position of

Full professor (100%) or Assistant Professor on Tenure Track (100%) in Migration Policy Analysis

Job Description: The candidate will teach 7 hours per week at the Master and BA level (4 hours for APTT), and is expected to supervise empirical work at the BA, MA and PhD level.

Requirements: The candidate must have a strong scientific record, documented teaching skills, and an ability to work and collaborate across disciplines. The applicant must have a background in political science with a focus on the analysis of migration and mobility in Switzerland as well as in the international context. She or he must demonstrate an expertise in areas such as policies, politics, and polity, and be able to combine these with migration and mobility studies. With regard to teaching and research, the candidate must be capable of offering a quantitative perspective. She or he will pursue analytical interests that are complementary with research undertaken by the SFM, the MAPS (Maison d'analyse des processus sociaux), and the professors of the "NCCR - On the Move" at the University of Neuchâtel. She or he must demonstrate an interest in and capacity for collaborative and interdisciplinary work, particularly at the SFM in both fundamental and applied research, but also within the "NCCR - On the Move" and the MAPS. The candidate must be able to practice a plurality of methodological approaches, with a specialization in quantitative and statistical methods, and have documented skills in teaching and supervising empirical work (BA, MA, PhD theses).

Application procedure: Candidates, who must hold a doctorate, will submit their application in a single pdf file on the portal www.unine.ch/candis (ref. FLSH-PolMigra) until **December 17, 2021**. Applications must include the following elements: a) A letter of motivation, a detailed curriculum vitae describing teaching and research activities, a list of publications, copies of titles obtained (doctorate and highest diploma before obtaining the doctorate); b) A list of three referees with statement of their relation to the applicant for a possible letter of recommendation; c) A statement on the scientific vision of the domain and the activities that the applicant wishes to develop as Professor at the University of Neuchâtel.

Starting date of the position: August 1, 2022 or upon agreement.

The position is also open to non-French speaking applicants who would temporarily teach in English within the framework of the *European Master in Migration Studies*, but who will commit to organizing their exams in French and to mastering French within two years after taking up their position.
