Dear colleagues interested in ocean and polar politics and our thematic group,  
It is just not too late to wish you a happy, successful and interesting new year - not exclusively but certainly also regarding all things Polar and Marine!  
We hope you stay connected with us and the group and to meet you in person at one or more of the many interesting Polar and Ocean politics events this year!

In this first mail of 2024 we announce the registration deadlines for our own events: the Thematic Group conference in Bamberg in February, and the DVPW-General Congress in Göttingen in October (1+2). These are followed by 5 marine and Arctic events for which abstract submission are still open or upcoming (3-7). Here we would specifically like to point out the EISA section on polar and ocean politics convened by our Hannes and Anja (6). ### 1. DVPW Thematic Group "Polar and Ocean Politics", Network Conference, **deadline for Registration, 05.02.2024**

The conference takes place in less than a month, *15-16 February, 2024, at the Otto-Friedrich-University Bamberg!* All interested in Polar and Ocean politics are welcome. There is no conference fee, but registration is required. There will be a conference dinner (self-paid), if you register, please indicate for the reservation whether you would like to participate.
