JSPS fellows for academic year 2024 (arrival in Japan between April 2024 and March 2025) for Postdocs, Mid-career to Professor. Duration of the Postdoctoral Fellowship is 12 - 24 months or 1 - 12 months. The Invitational Fellowship is for mid-career / professor level researchers with excellent records of research achievement to collaborate with Japanese colleagues. Duration of fellowship is 2 - 10 months or 14 - 60 days. Each type of fellowship has their own eligibility and some of them recruits multiple times depending on the arrival date in Japan. Theoretically-grounded projects focusing on one or more of the following themes are welcomed: Indigenous Law; Climate change and protection of polar values (e.g., cultural heritage, archaeology, biodiversity, wilderness); Climate change and pollution in the Polar Regions; Tourism in the Arctic and Indigenous People; Subsistence hunting in the Arctic; and Protected Areas in the Polar Regions.
