1. Follow-Up panel for our Themengruppentagung 2023, 30.03.2022, 16-17.30 online

2. Call for another DVPW-Thematic Group Conference "Internationale Organisationen in ihrer Umwelt", Deadline for abstract submission 16. April 2023!

The conference of the newly founded TG "Internationale Organisationen" takes place in Jena, 9-10.11.2023. The call reads: "Internationale Organisationen sind in dichte institutionelle Umwelten eingebettet. Einerseits konkurrieren sie mit anderen IOs und weiteren globalen Akteuren um Ressourcen und Autorität und besetzen Nischen in dicht besiedelten organisationalen Ökologien. Andererseits wird von IOs erwartet, dass sie mit nicht-staatlichen Akteuren und anderen IOs kooperieren, etwa in Form von Public-Private Partnerships. Dabei sind IOs diesen Dynamiken nicht nur passiv ausgesetzt, sondern gestalten die Regeln und Rahmenbedingungen für ihr globales Umfeld aktiv mit. So entstehen neue Gestaltungsspielräume, aber auch vielfältige Herausforderungen und Konflikte. Possible contributions to: "Was sind die Effekte von komplexen, dichten, aber auch fragmentierten institutionellen Räumen auf das Design von iOS? Wie wirken sie sich auf das Entstehen, die Vitalität und Performanz von IOs aus? Warum gehen IOs inter-organisationale Beziehungen ein? Welche Formen nehmen diese an (Arbeitsteilung/Konkurrenz)? Welche Faktoren beeinflussen mögliche Varianzen? Welche Probleme ergeben sich in den unterschiedlichen inter-organisationalen Beziehungsformen? Wie gehen die beteiligten IOs damit um? Wie regieren IOs auf unterschiedliche Anforderungen aus ihrer jeweiligen Umwelt? Lassen sich hier spezifische Handlungsmuster erkennen? Zu welchen Ergebnissen können diese führen? Wie wirken sich inter-organisationale Dynamiken auf die globale Problembearbeitung sowie die Legitimität von IOs aus? Welche Konsequenzen hat die zunehmende Komplexität für die globale Ordnung (Fragmentierung, Gridlock, Innovation etc.)?"
